Welcome back to school. It has been lovely teaching Sycamore Class this week. We have started looking at our theme of **The Romans**. We thought about what

OPAL PLAYTIMES in action

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The OPAL working party (Miss Wills, Jen Sigournay, Helen Cracknell, Mrs Armstrong, Mrs Betteridge) spent a few days over Easter improving the play areas for the pupils. We have opened up part of Forest School for playtimes and created a sandpit from a tractor tyre, we have opened the entrance from the Trim trail to the Forest school by way of a slide, we have introduced "Noodle Combat" (noodle and noodle only!), we built an arbour donated by SEVERN VALLEY Woodworks and improved the recent mud kitchen, adding a den area. We also have created a wiggle track using *wiggle cars* that zoom downhill and built a stage. There is now a guiet zone, for reading, drawing and LEGO play and a water wall, where pupils can create a waterfall using drainpipes fixed to the fence. There is more to come!



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We have some information about a game called Poppy Playtime that some children may be playing at home.



Online safety experts have been alerted to a video game, being described by some users as an "introduction to horror." Videos, versions of the game, and associated material are becoming increasingly popular on YouTube, Roblox, and other platforms used by young children.

Poppy Playtime features frightening images and themes that are paired with childfriendly items. This may be especially upsetting to children who have not yet developed the resilience to deal with disturbing content.

There are multiple risks that can arise from children and young people being exposed to frightening content before they are prepared.
