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Class News



CHESTNUTS

The children have all settled back into the routine of Chestnuts. They have been busy in Forest School building dens and looking at the wildlife that is all around them. Last week

they all got to see a very large moth up close that they found under the bottom of the slide. They have also enjoyed using the outdoor area for race tracks using the crates and drain pipes, and looking after the babies - bathing them and getting them dressed. The children have enjoyed sitting in the tepee and looking at books.



WILLOW

Willow Class have been reading "Stanley's Stick" in English. They have created their own version of the story and are currently writing this up in their own booklet. In Science we have been learning about materials and objects. We have also looked at different

properties of objects. In History we have been looking at houses and how they have changed. In Maths, Y1s have been learning about money, identifying different coins and notes. Reception have been practicing number formation and subitising.



SYCAMORE

We are delighted to have Miss Wills back in the classroom. She has been teaching the children about the artist Turner and the locating the countries in North America.

In English, we have been reading the Thames and Tide Club - a Secret City. We have been using adverbs such as rapidly, strangely and unusually at the start and middle of sentences. Today we also used these to write a weather forecast. We have been looking at the endings of words in spelling, does it end in le, el or al. We have been practising using the homophones **to**,**two** and **too**. We are learning to spell these tricky words; **move**, **improve**, **people**, **friend**, **who and whole**. Please challenge your child to spell these at home. In Maths Y2 are continuing to tell the time, focusing on minutes past the hour and minutes to the hour, in 5 minute intervals. Such as 5 to 9, 25 past 3. In Y3 we have been learning about money. Any practising paying with coins would be great.



ΟΑΚ

Oak class have started their term with lots of great work. In English we are looking at Romeo and Juliet; we discovered the scene of a crime on our first morning back, where

something terrible had happened. We've then learned more about the build up to this from the Shakespeare play. We've written a recount of the first scene, and a diary entry from Romeo and Juliet's first meeting. In Science we explored how our eyes work so that we can see, and in Art we've studied Ancient Greek architecture and the different types of columns.

In our History we're learning about what the Ancient Greeks invented that we still use now, such as democracy. We've looked at the roles of men and women in Ancient Greece and their lasting achievements in sport, maths and day to day lives.
