been busy taking part in various Easter craft activities.



WILLOW

Willow Class loved celebrating Mother's Day during the special service, where the children shared their own messages about why they love their mums. As part of our PSHE learning, we had a dedicated day in the Life Tent, where the children met Harold

and explored important wellbeing topics. In Science, we planted runner beans and are excited to watch them grow while in Geography, we have been exploring Europe, focusing on the differences between countries like France and England. In English we have been writing our own narratives of Jack and the Beanstalk and the receptions have been roleplaying the story. In Maths Year 1 have been subtracting, adding and partitioning numbers up to 19. We also hope you enjoyed our Easter song "I'm a spring chicken." Willow Class have had so much fun practicing it in class!



SYCAMORE

We were so proud of Sycamore Class' performance of their Mothers' Day Poem last week. In Maths, Y2 have been learning about fractions. We have learnt how to find

fractions of numbers and shapes, focusing on one third, two guarters and three guarters. Following on from practising the written methods for addition and subtraction, the Y3s in maths, have been learning how to do written methods for multiplication of 2 digit number by a one digit number, such as 46 x 4. This needs lots of practise of the 3 and 4 times tables. We have been learning to spell plural words, such as body - bodies, baby - babies and Party - parties. We are also learning to spell the Common Exception words of "People" and "Friends". In English, we have been writing a nonfiction poster, to help us to look after our planet better.



OAK

Oak class have been continuing our 'Three Little Pigs' English project where we've had to think about presenting opinions in a formal and informal manner. In History, we've

explored local folk history and have tried to answer 'Who Killed the Bear?' In our DT we have researched, written instructions for, built and then evaluated our own paper trebuchets. Some of them were a real success and everyone managed a good working model! We all enjoyed our life tent PSHE session where we learnt about ways of being assertive and a bit about legal and illegal drugs. We've all managed to show our best in assessment week this week and are looking forward to a fun last week of term.
