As I write this we are all very excited about our school trip to the Corinium Museum to learn more about everyday life in Britain in the Roman times.



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We would like to make you aware of the **holiday Free School Meal (FSM) voucher scheme** that Gloucestershire County Council is currently offering to families in Gloucestershire.

The holiday vouchers are designed to support the families of eligible children in reception to year 11 who receive Pupil Premium (income-related) free school meals and attend a school in Gloucestershire, where no other support is available.

Gloucestershire County Council is committed to supporting families with 2 weeks of vouchers at £15 per eligible child, per week for the Summer 2024 holiday.

The other 4 weeks of the holiday are supported through the HAF programme, which provides a meal for children attending the activities they are booked onto. For more information,

please visit <u>Gloucestershire HAF</u> where you can also sign up to the Children's Activities Booking System (CABS). The HAF programme is a separate scheme, and vouchers cannot be issued as an alternative.

Applications for holiday FSM vouchers for Summer 2024 holiday will be open from **midday 25 June** 2024 until **midday on 09 July 2024**. We will be unable to accept any applications after this date. Vouchers will be distributed to families the week commencing 15 July 2024.

Families can apply to the holiday voucher scheme via our website here: <u>Holiday free school meal</u> <u>vouchers | Gloucestershire County Council</u>. Please note we check eligibility for the scheme by crossreferencing with the term-time free school meal register, so please make sure you have registered your child beforehand.

Families who have signed up previously do not need to re-register. For any families wishing to update details of an existing application, please email <u>childrensfund@gloucestershire.gov.uk</u> by 10 July 2024, so we can update your account before the voucher codes are issued.

Safeguarding updates for Parents and Carers: ONLINE SAFETY

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FALKE NEWS

In 2021, research from the <u>UK Safer Internet Centre</u> explored how 'Half of young people encounter misleading content online on a daily basis'. Alongside this, the research also found that '48% of young people are seeing misleading content every day, with more than one in 10 seeing it more than six times a day – often leaving them feeling annoyed, upset, sad, angry, attacked or scared'

To help combat the impact of misinformation, the <u>Online Media</u> <u>Literacy Strategy</u> was launched to, in part, 'support teachers, carers, youth workers and librarians in their skills to help children and young people in their critical thinking skills, to spot misinformation online.'

Teachers, parents and carers can utilise guidance such as the Online Media Literacy Strategy to help young people spot misinformation on social media and across other online platforms.
