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#### **Class News**

**CHESTNUTS** Welcome back to both returning children and new starters! All the children have settled back into the routine of Chestnuts. This week the children have been learning all about the number one, and singing our focus nursery rhyme - Twinkle, twinkle little star. They have started to talk about different emotions and what they feel like when they have these emotions and drawing pictures of themselves as part of the Marvellous me! topic we are looking at over the next few weeks.



**WILLOW** The children have all settled in wonderfully and are enjoying spending time doing different learning activities. The Reception children are getting the hang of the school routines and are enjoying joining in with songs and art activities. They have been practising writing their name and completing cutting activities. The Year 1s are setting a

fantastic example to the Reception children and are working really hard. Over the last week, we have been looking at art work inspired by Lowry. The children have completed a class art display, creating mini figures to add to the busy town. In History, we have been learning about our families, remembering events in the past and creating questions to ask a local visitor. In Computing, we have looked at what technology is and sorting objects correctly. In English we have been reading the story 'The day the crayons quit' and have explored using different colours. In Maths, the Reception children have been looking at ways to represent numbers 1 and 2 and ordering items from smallest to largest. The Year 1 children have been looking at reading and writing numbers to 20 in numerals and words.



#### SYCAMORE

Sycamore Class have settled in well to the new school year. The Year 3s have been welcoming the new Year 2s into our class. Last week we talked lots about our school

values and came up with sentences for each value, what we do in Sycamore Class to show the values. We talked about how to be purple learners. In English we have started our new book,' Jim and the Beanstalk'. We have been on Times Tables Rock Stars and the children will have come home this week with their logins.
