
# OAK

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# Was your child born between 1 September 2018 and 31 August 2019?



Any child born between the above dates can start school in the school year starting from **1 September 2023**. Gloucestershire County Council co-ordinates the admission of children to primary or infant school therefore you must apply to us to receive a school place for your child by the closing date **15 January 2023** 

If you have not heard from us by 1<sup>st</sup> December you must contact us so we can send you the information you will need to apply for a school place. If you do not apply on time you may not get a place at the school you want.



November 2022 – You should receive a letter from us advising you how to apply for a school place

15 January 2023 – Deadline for making your application 17 April 2023 – Allocation Day (find out which school we can offer your child)
