

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CLASS NEWS



CHESTNUTS

Chestnuts have been busy finishing off their 'Out of this world' theme before we broke up for half term. Now we are focusing on 'Eric Carle' for the rest of this term. This week we started off with 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar'. The children have been making Caterpillars and going on a bug hunt in our role-play area. They have also started learning about the life cycle of the Butterfly.



WILLOW

This week we started our theme People Who Help Us. We had a visit from Sarah, a police officer, who showed us all her police equipment and talked about her job as a police officer. Before her visit the children wrote questions they wanted to ask her and after her visit they drew and labelled a picture of her then wrote about her visit. In Computing we have looked at what information

technology the police use in their jobs. In R.E we learnt about Palm Sunday. We sang a song called Hosanna and made palm leaves. For DT, Police Office Sarah asked us to design and make a police car. We learnt about axles and wheels and we experimented with dowelling and wheels. In Maths the year 1s have been partitioning 7 and 9. Reception have been ordering numbers up to 10.



SYCAMORE

Sycamore class have begun to write a holiday brochure about Skara Brae. We are learning about persuasive features in writing, including rhetorical questions. In maths, Y3 are continuing their

learning about fractions, including comparing and ordering fractions, whilst Y2 have been learning to divide. In our history lessons, we have entered the Bronze Age and we have begun to learn to sew in DT. In music, we are continuing to learn recorders and cannot wait to share our musical skills in a few weeks' time.



OAK

Oak class have had a busy week back. Our Netball team came second in their group in the tournament at the start of the week - well done team Westbury. In literacy we have started to explore our new book, 'Owl Moon' by Jane Yolen. We're focusing on the use of figurative language and are being inspired by the beautiful pictures to create our own adapted version in a few weeks' time. We've also started our new unit in RE looking at what Christians mean when they call Jesus a King.


