CHESTNUTS

The children have settled back into routine after half term, they have been telling their peers about some of the adventures they have been on. This week the children have started to learn about 2D shapes. It has been fun trying to pick out different shapes they find in their everyday life moving around different environments. The children have also had fun celebrating Shrove Tuesday - they joined together with Willow class to have an afternoon of pancake activities! WILLOW

We have been busy in Willow Class creating bird houses, we planned them out before constructing them and have decorated them. In Science we have been looking at how we should look after different animals in preparation for our trip to Cotswolds Wildlife

Park. On Shrove Tuesday we made pancakes and prepared the fruit for them. In Maths the Y1s have been looking at partition/addition/subtraction facts to 15 and Reception have been looking at partitioning the number 7. We have been reading 'Room on the Broom' in English and been focusing on capital letters and rhyming words. What a lovely few weeks in Willow Class!



SYCAMORE

In Sycamore Class we have been making good progress with our recorder playing on a Monday morning - it is a lovely way to start the week. In Maths we have started new

topics. Year 3 have begun a unit on learning the written methods for addition, where we need to exchange the ones and tens- 247 + 138 = . We have learnt the importance of lining up the Hundreds, Tens and Ones correctly on squared paper so that we add accurately. In Year 2 we have begun our multiplication unit focusing on counting up in steps of 2 and building the 2 times table. Please practice at home! We go as far as $12 \times 2 = 24$. Thanks to everyone who is logging in to Times Tables Rockstars regularly. We have been thinking about and writing settings in English, writing in the past tense and developing noun phrases, based on the senses.



OAK

Oak class had a wonderful trip last week where we were lucky enough to have a guided tour of the church and bell tower, thanks to Mrs Down and Mr Phelps. We've learnt lots

about the history of both buildings and found out lots of new facts. Elliot said it was, "like unlocking all of the secrets we've walked past but never knew were there." Back in the classroom, Years 5 and 6 have been exploring converting percentages and fractions and Year 4 have started using formal methods of division in our maths. We've explored Ordnance Survey maps and symbols in Geography and looked at our civil war battles in history - including a local one at Westbury church.
