#### CLASS NEWS

#### **CHESTNUTS**

Chestnuts have been looking at all the different signs of spring appearing in forest school over the last week. They even had a look in the pond to see if they could see the tadpoles that they put in the pond at the end of last term. On Friday, they took part in their first 'Bikeability' session which was all about balancing. They all did really well and had lots of fun.

#### **WILLOW**

In Willow Class, we have started our new theme - **Once Upon a Time**. We have been reading and writing the story of the 3 little pigs. In Science last week, the three little pigs wrote Willow Class a letter asking for help! They wanted to know what materials are and ferent materials objects are made from. The children wrote back to let them know the

what different materials objects are made from. The children wrote back to let them know the answers to their questions. This week in Science, two of the pigs wrote another letter! They wanted to know the properties of straw and wood and they wanted to know why these materials didn't work for their houses. In Geography, we learnt about a compass. We used compasses in Forest School to find the three little pigs and the wolf! In History we have been looking at the history of houses and have explored Celtic roundhouses, Anglo-Saxon houses and Tudor houses. In Mastery Maths we have been learning about even and odd numbers and counting one more and one less. In Maths we have been learning about 3D shapes such as cuboids, cubes

# and pyramids. **SYCAMORE**

Sycamore have had a flying start to the new term! Our new theme is ' *Was London better before or after the Great Fire?*' We have begun our DT learning by eating and comparing cakes made with a recipe from 1666 to modern times. In History, we investigated who buried cheese in their garden and read about significant people at the time of the Great Fire. In Science, we looked at the artefacts from the John Moore Museum and discussed the materials they are made of, we then drew and labelled them. In music, we have been singing London's Burning in a round. In RE, we are answering the question 'What is God like to follow?' This began with learning about Noah and the Ark. In French, we are continuing to count. In Maths, Y2 are learning about fractions whilst Y3 are solving subtraction problems with a written column method.

#### OAK

Oak class have made a great start to their new theme of **India**. They have been sampling tasty Indian snacks, exploring the physical geographical features of India, creating Indian art in the form of Mandalas, and experimenting with learning some Hindi words! We are reading the book Thirst by Varsha Bajaj which is all about water equity in India. In Maths, Y6 are working on ratio and proportion, Y5 on fractions and Y4 on column subtraction. In RE we have been exploring the concept of Brahman.

# Staffing updates

We would like to welcome Mr William Bruce to our school.

He is the new teacher in Oak Class and has started working this term on Mondays and Fridays. Mr Bruce is an experienced primary teacher who lives in Cheltenham with his wife and 2 children. He will lead Geography and PSHE. We hope he will be very happy here and feel confident that he will be a wonderful addition to our staff team.

Let me also take this opportunity to introduce you to **Miss Ruth Eccles**, who has been working on Mondays in a 1:1 capacity with pupils, supporting them with their reading. Miss Eccles is officially our "Covid Catch up" teacher, funded for by the Covid Catch up funding from the Dept for Education that was given to all schools following the pandemic. She also acts as a supply teacher for all classes as and when needed. Miss Eccles is a very experienced teacher of more than 25 years. On the days when she is not working here at Westbury, she works as a Link Tutor for the University of Gloucestershire, visiting student teachers on placement. She also works as a Cub and Beaver Assistant at Randwick Scout Group.
