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CLASS NEWS

CHESTNUTS

The children in Chestnuts have been looking after worms in their wormery over the last couple of weeks. They have enjoyed watching the worms tunnel their way round in the soil. This week we let the worms go, so please keep an eye out for the tapestry posts in the next week showing you all about the wormery. The children have really enjoyed listening to the Hairy Maclary stories which are coming to an end and now are starting to focus on Easter for our last week of term.

WILLOW



Willow Class have been learning about real life superheroes, in History. They have learnt about Rosa Parks, Emily Davison and Florence Nightingale. In DT, the children created a design of their own superhero cape and mask! Then, they made their superhero outfit using different tools and materials. On Friday, the 'Willow Class Superheroes' paraded

through school to show everyone their amazing outfits. In RE we have continued to look at the Easter Story. The children made Easter gardens last week and we discussed why Christians place a cross in the Easter gardens. We have started our unit looking at a new book, Send for a Superhero. The children wrote descriptions about the baddies from the book, Filth and Vacuum and they created a wanted poster. In Maths, the children learnt more about telling the time and learnt half past. The Year 1s have also continued their addition and subtraction unit looking at the numbers 12, 13 and 14.

We are nearing the end of our learning all about light this term. We have been researching significant scientists from the past and completed great biographies about the Wright Brothers. In French, we are learning the days of the week and fruit, whilst

reading The Very Hungry Caterpillar in french. In RE, we have explored in further detail the significance of Pentecost. In PE, we have been playing ball games and learning to use our hands like in volleyball. We have been lucky with the weather in outdoor learning! Another busy couple of weeks in Sycamore

OAK

The last few weeks Oak class have been working on their Street Art project. This week we have drawn out our tags and created a brick backdrop for them - we will be adding stencils next week. In English we have started reading the book 'My Granny came here on the Empire Windrush'. We've learnt all about the journey made by so many people and

Attendance update

Whole school from September 2023- 92.3%

Whole School Target - 96%

Pupils with attendance below 90% are classed as Persistent Absentees. Their attendance will be monitored closely by the Headteacher. If there are concerns, we arrange a meeting with parents and carers to help improve attendance. Teachers will be sharing your child's current attendance data at parents' evening with you. Authorised and Unauthorised absences count the same- they are both still absence. Unauthorised absences can trigger fines from the Local Authority when they continue for five days (or more) in a row.





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Restorative Conversations

You may have heard us or your child talking about *Restorative conversations*.

Last summer staff received training on how to facilitate a restorative conversation. We only have a restorative conversation when everyone is calm and everyone can agree to listen to the other person's point of view.

We use **Restorative conversations** to resolve conflict or misunderstandings between pupils and they have had a hugely positive impact on the relationships between pupils in school and building trust in the school community.

They are a key part of our behaviour strategy and enable everyone to feel listened to and that their side of the story has been heard. You might like to try them at home for conflict resolution situations! We use these "scripts" for the different age ranges in school.

Restorative questions for EYFS (ages 3-5)

- > What happened?
- ➤ How do you feel? (How do you think the others feel?)
- ➤ How can we put things right?

Restorative questions for Y1- Y4 (ages 6-8)

- What happened?
- What were you thinking when that happened?
- ➤ How do you feel now?
- ➤ Who was involved?
- ➤ How might they be feeling now?
- What can we do to put things right?

Restorative questions for Y5 and Y6 (ages 9-11)

- ➤ What happened? What were you thinking at the time? What are your thoughts since?
- ➤ Who has been affected by what has happened? In what way?
- What needs to happen to put things right?
- What will you do differently next time?
