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CHESTNUTS

Class News

Chestnuts have been busy learning all about the number 4 and 5, talking about someone who is special to them and why. In Forest School, all of the children made a hedgehog. The focus story this week is 'Little Red Riding Hood' and they have been singing about 'Incy Wincy Spider'.



WILLOW

In Willow Class we have been writing our own version of *Where the Wild* Things Are. In Maths, Year 1 have been ordering numbers to 20 and working out which number is bigger/smaller. Reception children have been comparing

two sets of objects and working out which set is bigger. They have continued their learning around Shape, Space and Measure. In art, we have been learning about the artist Picasso and have begun to complete self-portraits. We're having lots of fun exploring our features and noticing details about our peers. In RE we have been studying the Creation story, we've been on nature walks and thought about what in the world we are thankful for. We've been busy in PE looking at balancing, jumping, throwing and catching. We created a circus in the hall and became jugglers, trapeze experts and we performed our acrobatics!

SYCAMORE

In Sycamore Class we have continued to look at the Gunpowder Plot and have learned about how and why we celebrate Bonfire Night. The children shared

their experiences and created a poster. In English we are writing our own sequel to Jim and the Beanstalk and have come up with other ways to help the Giant in our story. In Maths the years 2s have been ordering 2 digit numbers, the year 3s have been working on number lines and counting in 50s and 100s. The children all enjoyed National Poetry Day last week where they performed a poem to the whole school and wrote their own versions of the poem.



OAK

Over the last few weeks Oak class have started exploring the book 'Hidden Figures' where we're learning about the lives of the real life 'computers' - who

worked to write code for NASA. We've written reports, jobs adverts and mini-biographies. In Geography this week we'll be looking at how the layers of the earth are formed and in Computing we are programming an object to move. In Maths the Year 4s have learnt a rounding rap to help us round to the nearest 10,100 and 1000, Year 5 have been ordering and comparing numbers up to 1,000,000 and the Year 6s have learnt what to do with a remainder when dividing.

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Is your child eligible to Benefit Based Free School Meals? The school receives additional funding if your child is.

This helps towards additional school provision plus children will be entitled to free school milk and a chance to enrol in holiday activities. Even if your child is in KS1 and already receives KS1 Universal Free School Meals please apply if you think you are eligible.

If you need help, we can support you in school with completing the form,

Why should I apply?

For every child that is entitled to free school meals the school receives extra funding to enhance provision and improve progress and outcomes for children. So please apply even if you do not wish to take up your free school meal.

What are the qualifying criteria for Free School Meals? Your child might be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- **Universal Credit** your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
- How long will it take to get a response? You will receive an instant response once you

have submitted your claim.
