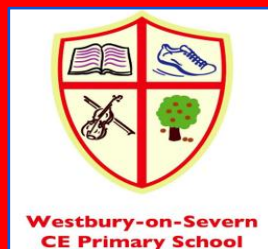

And a Happy New Year for 2026! We will see you again on 6th January.

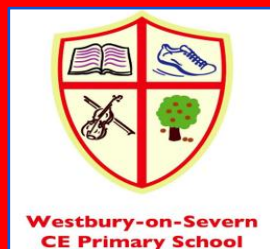

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Class News



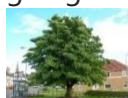
CHESTNUTS

SYCAMORE

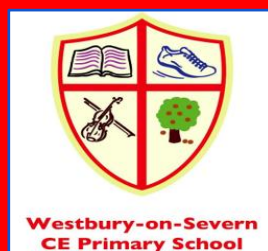

In **English**, the children have been immersed in *The Polar Express*. They explored the story through reading, discussion, and creative writing, focusing on atmosphere, descriptive language, and the themes of belief, wonder, and imagination. In **Art**, pupils studied the work of **Giuseppe Arcimboldo** and created their own imaginative portraits inspired by his unique style. The class also explored how the meaning of Christmas has changed over time, comparing its religious origins with how it is celebrated today. We've loved our topic on **Chocolate and the Maya**, learning about the origins of chocolate and its importance in Maya civilisation. This learning was brought together in a fun cross-curricular project inspired by *Charlie and the Chocolate Factory*.
