## CHESTNUTS

Chestnuts have had a busy start to Autumn term 2. They have started to learn the songs for this year's Nativity. This week the children have been taking part in Nursery Rhyme week where they have been focusing on a different rhyme each day. On Monday the children took part in the Remembrance Day celebrations, they made sun catcher poppies for the windows and took part in the 2-minute silence. We have started our phonics programme with a letter each week. Keep an eye out for emails each week saying what the letter is for the coming week. The children have enjoyed bringing in items from home for 'What's in the box?"



#### WILLOW

In Willow Class we have been super busy since starting our rehearsals for our up coming nativity play. Together, we have been practicing our lines and learning the lyrics for the songs. We are all super excited for our performance! We also been continuing with our

English work on the text '**Cave Baby'**, we created story maps to help us retell the narrative. In Maths, the Year 1s have working hard on their place value skills up to 100, while the Receptions have been learning about the language 'whole' and 'part'. In Geography, we did some fieldwork in our local area and spotted human and physical features. We also took part in Remembrance art activities and created a poppy wreath for our classroom door to honour those who have served.



#### SYCAMORE

Sycamore Class had a great few days of art last week where we learnt about George Seurat and his technique of Pointillism. We created our own piece of Pointillism of

fireworks. In English we have written poems about the Earth and are now writing about adventures we have had as part of our explorers' club. In Maths Year 3s are looking at their 3s and 4 times tables. Year 2 have been learning to add 9 by adding 10 and subtracting 1.

We've started our new book **'The Iron Man'** in English - please have a look at Zach's work to see what has been happening in the class (can you spot the prepositions we've

been working hard to use?) In computing we've been using a repeat code to program designs for wrapping paper using Logo online and we've been busy learning the chords, C and G in guitar sessions. 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## Is your child eligible to Benefit Based Free School Meals? The school receives additional funding if your child is.

This helps towards additional school provision plus children will be entitled to free school milk and a chance to enroll in holiday activities. Even if your child is in KS1 and already receives KS1 Universal Free School Meals please apply if you think you are eligible.

The school census is on *Thursday 3rd October* so if you can apply and get confirmation before then funding will be given from next April. If you need help, we can support you in school with completing the form,

## Why should I apply?

For every child that is entitled to free school meals the school receives extra funding to enhance provision and improve progress and outcomes for children. So please apply even if you do not wish to take up your free school meal.

What are the qualifying criteria for Free School Meals? Your child might be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- **Universal Credit** your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
- How long will it take to get a response? You will receive an instant response once you

have submitted your claim.
