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CHESTNUTS



This week Chestnuts have been looking after caterpillars, they are going to watch them grow over the next few weeks and then release them into Forest School when they turn into butterflies. They have also been learning about patterns and what comes next. The

children due to start school in September have started to talk about starting school and what it might feel like. We will work on this more over the coming weeks. If you have children that are turning Preschool age and are considering sending them to Chestnuts, please could you get in touch with us.



WILLOW In Willow Class, we have started our new theme, Off We Go! We carried out an investigation in Science to answer the question, 'How can we make a balloon powered car go further?' We made verbal predictions, carried out the investigation, helped to measure how far the car went each time, and answered our

investigation question. In Literacy, we have started our new book, **'The Magic Bed'**, by John Burningham. We predicted where we thought the magic bed could go and we learnt about proper and common nouns. We identified and labelled the proper and common nouns found in the book. In Numeracy, we carried on with our measurement unit. We learnt about the mass of an object, heavier and lighter, and how to put objects in order from lightest to heaviest. In Art, we learnt about sculpture. We made small sculptures of natural objects that we found at Forest School. In Music, we are extending our skills in playing the ukulele and we have learnt lots of songs. We can't wait to show you how talented we are at our concert on the 3rd of July.



SYCAMORE We have started our new book in English this term –'**The Last Garden**'. The book is about the last garden in a war torn city. The children have been writing descriptions about the garden and the city and using conjunctions to compare these. In

Maths the Year 3s have started their unit on multiplication and division and the Year 2s have started their unit on length and mass. We have started our Science topic looking at plants and have identified the different parts of a flowering plant. We have been learning about what life was like in Romans times and how it has influenced our lives today.



OAK

Over the last few weeks Oak class have finished their unit in PSHE with sessions on anatomy and how humans reproduce. The children have all been so sensible during this

topic - I've been really impressed. In our Science we have started to look at the circulatory system with an exploration of some real hearts. In English we have been reading the book, **'The Unforgotten Coat'.** The children have really enjoyed the text and will start writing their own short story inspired by the text next week.

FAMILY FRIDAYS on the FIELD

As part of our OPAL programme we want to extend play opportunities to families <u>out of school hours.</u>

We are therefore opening up our new school field to families every Friday after school until 5pm from **21st June** until the end of term for free family play. We are inviting families to use our field to play/picnic/socialise on- maybe bringing bikes, or footballs (use the goals) and enjoy the space. We ask that you do <u>not</u> use Forest School, the trim trail or the wiggle cars (for now) but children can select play equipment from the playground shed and bring it down to the field. (Our long term aim is to develop the field with more play equipment.) Please make sure all play equipment is returned tidily before you leave and that your children are supervised at all times. *Parents must take full responsibility for their children during this time*. Mrs Armstrong will be in school till 5pm and toilets will be available to use in school. We will open the side gate so that you can walk straight down to the field after school. Please do not bring dogs with you.
