Next week we will find out more about this photo. In Science we have been learning about the different groups of animals. In Maths Year 1s have been using grouping and sharing for division. Reception children have started using "Rekenreks" in their Maths lessons- these are a type of abacus. In English we are reading the story of "The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch".




SYCAMORE

It has been a busy start to term 6! We finished our River poems, which are great, and published them on our watercolour maps. In Maths, we are finishing our multiplying and dividing unit in Y3 and statistics in Y2. In DT, we have tasted different types of bread and will be designing and baking our own bread. In French, we are learning the alphabet, whilst in Music we composed a piece of music depicting the emotions around the Great Fire of London. In outdoor learning, we learnt about wattle and daub from Tudor times.



OAK

In Oak Class, we have continued to enjoy exploring our topic of India. This has involved a lot of fun learning activities as well as much focused work. We have learned a Bhangra dance in music and have explored how the Himalayan mountains were formed in Geography with the help of Mars bars. We have reflected on the importance of respecting everyone by considering the Hindu concept of all living things sharing a divine spark. In our writing we have read some Indian deity origin stories as well as fictional adventure stories set in Indian cities. And on top of all this, we also arranged the weather to be hot so that we can better experience what living in a different climate might be like!

Monday: PE with Mr Knight as usual and Sports morning practice for all classes


