CHESTNUTS

In Chestnuts, the children have been learning all about the number 2 and 3. The focus story is Three **Billy Goats Gruff.** The children have loved joining in with the story and re-enacting out when role playing. In Forest School they have helped with weeding the raised beds and digging compost into them. This week it's all about shelter building!



WILLOW

In Willow Class, we have been reading the book Where the Wild Things are. We were very surprised to see giant white footprints in our Forest School and explored who might have left them behind. We enjoyed performing a wild rumpus dance, retelling a poem

using music and getting stuck in utilising Play Doh and paint to create our very own Wild Things. In Maths, the Year 1s have been looking at representing numbers to 20. Reception have been exploring and counting numbers to 5. In History, we were very lucky to have a guest speaker David D'Ambrogio visit us to talk about life growing up in Westbury. We have been looking at different jobs that people have had in the past and we went on a trip to Hopewell Colliery to investigate what it would have been like working down a mine in the Forest of Dean.



SYCAMORE

Sycamore Class have settled in well. We have continued to read our Class book Jim and the Beanstalk and the children have retold the story in their own words. We are now starting to get ready to create our own sequel for the book. In Maths the children have been partitioning numbers in different ways and have been placing them on number lines. In History we have been learning about The Gunpowder Plot and the children have written storyboards to retell

the story and have drawn pictures for this. In Computing we have been creating pictograms on the computer and learning about how much quicker it is to create them on the computer than on paper.



OAK

We have nearly finished our unit in English all about the mars rover Curiosity. We've created our own plans for a new rover and have used our new skills to write a report on

its features. In maths we've all looked at place value and the Year 6s have learnt how to multiply a decimal by a whole number. In RE we've explored some of the gospel stories to try and understand how they help Christians live a better life. In Art we've completed our project on Peter Thorpe and have created some great artwork inspired by his rockets.

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Is your child eligible to Benefit Based Free School Meals?

The school receives additional funding if your child is.

This helps towards additional school provision plus children will be entitled to free school milk and a chance to enrol in holiday activities. Even if your child is in KS1 and already receives KS1 Universal Free School Meals please apply if you think you are eligible.

If you think you are eligible please apply as soon as possible using this link:

The school census is on *Thursday 3rd October* so if you can apply and get confirmation before then funding will be given from next April. If you need help, we can support you in school with completing the form,

Why should I apply?

For every child that is entitled to free school meals the school receives extra funding to enhance provision and improve progress and outcomes for children. So please apply even if you do not wish to take up your free school meal.

What are the qualifying criteria for Free School Meals?

Your child might be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- **Universal Credit** your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
- How long will it take to get a response? You will receive an instant response once you have submitted your claim. All you need is your National Insurance Number and an email address.
