### CHESTNUTS

Welcome back to everyone and to our new starters! The children have settled back into the routine after the Christmas break. They have been very creative doing lots of painting and sticking. The children have enjoyed our focus story - "The Very Hungry Caterpillar" by Eric Carle

#### WILLOW

Willow Class have had an excellent start to the term. We have been busy looking at the books **'The Odd Egg'** as we begin our new topic 'Dinosaurs, sticks and stones'. In Maths, Year 1 have been developing their place value skills, exploring number facts to

10. Reception children have been busy subitising 1 digit numbers to 6. In History, the children have had great fun exploring fossils and learning about the famous palaeontologist Mary Anning. We have observed artefacts closely and explored how difficult it is to maintain fossil remains by carefully trying to dissect chocolate chips from a cookie! In PE, the children have been working on their target skills and perfecting their throwing skills. In Science, the children have started their new unit Animals including humans - Year 1 have been identifying different carnivore, herbivore and omnivores.

#### **SYCAMORE**

Miss George and Mrs Eccles are enjoying spending more time in Sycamore Class. In history, we have been learning about "The Stone Age". We ordered events on a

timeline to help us understand when it was, compared to now. In English we are reading a story related to our Stone Age topic, called **The First Drawing**. It tells the story of an imaginative child, living thirty thousand years ago, who sees the shapes of animals in clouds, in rocks or on the walls and shares his thoughts with his family. In Science we tested how different surfaces affected the speed and distance travelled by toy cars. In RE, our new topic is "What make some places sacred to believers?" In Maths Y3 and Y2 have been working hard doing subtraction, learning some different methods to subtract.



**OAK** Oak class have started their new theme all about Westbury-on-Severn. We've compared maps of the village from the late 1800s and today. In Geography we've learnt about the counties in the UK and how we can talk about them. In English we're exploring

the traditional tales from the Brothers Grimm and how found out that they end happily ever after but can be quite dark! In Maths we've been looking at formal written method - Year 4 addition and Year 5 multiplication. The Year 6s have been adding mixed number fractions. In French we are learning how to describe the weather- *"Il y a des nuages"* - has been the weather this week!
