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CLASS NEWS

CHESTNUTS

This week in Chestnuts the children have been busy learning some new PE skills - they have been learning how to do Star Jumps, marching with our legs and arms and balancing on one foot (which was very tricky). These will help the children to develop their coordination skills. They have also been doing lots of mark making and letter recognition for the letters of their names. Our letter and sound for the week has been 'C'.

WILLOW

In English we have been writing instructions on how to wash a woolly mammoth based on the book of the same name. In Maths the Year 1s have been comparing two digit numbers and finding one more and one less. In Mastering Number they have been

looking at number bonds to 10. Reception children have continued their Maths journey by looking at 5 and a bit for numbers up to 10. In computing we talked about what animation is and the children have created their own mini animation of a dinosaur. They look great! Yesterday we had a wonderful time at All Things Wild. The children all behaved very well. We went on a journey through time back to the Triassic, Jurassic, and Cretaceous Periods learning about all the dinosaurs from the

different periods. We then looked at different fossils and had a go at digging for them.

SYCAMORE

What a wonderful couple of weeks in Sycamore Class. We have been exploring the mysteries of Skara Brae and Stonehenge in our history lessons. As scientists, we have been investigating magnetic force and are creating a fridge magnet. In English, we have reached the end of our unit on Stone Age Boy and writing our own narratives in the style of the story. We are continuing to subtract, multiply and learn about shape and money in maths. We have had the laptops out to practice our times tables on Times Tables Rock Stars, we've got a few Rock Legends in our midst!

OAK

Oak class have continued to explore scientific and religious explanations of creation. Over the last few weeks we've thought about what questions religion and science can answer and if you can be both a scientist and religious. We've explored famous scientists whose faith is important to them and have learnt about how they feel religion has helped them. In English, we have started a new unit where we're discussing climate change. We've looked at some weather phenomena and how we can report on this - creating empathy using the passive voice and sharing detail with modifying adjectives.

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
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Mrs. Roseblade would like to remind parents of Oak Class children of the meeting on Wednesday 15th




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Safeguarding Updates
